Dear Mr. Kreng:

Thank you for your letter of October 8, which has been referred to this office for reply.

I regret to inform you that the numerical and other limitations imposed on the refugee program by the Inter-Agency Task Force on Refugees, in consultation with Congress, do not permit us to parole Mr. Lor Khun Leang and his family into the United States at this time. The primary qualifications for parole have been close relatives in the United States as U.S. citizens, permanent resident aliens; or refugees; or former U.S. government employment. It appears Mr. Lor does not fall into these categories.

Should you have further questions on the parole procedure, I suggest you write to the Inter-Agency Task Force, c/o the Department of State, Washington, D.C. 20520, or to the office of the Attorney General, in whom the parole authority resides.
