22. MEMORIAL FLAG (TUNG ROLOK)

The Cambodian Memorial Flag is raised during ceremonies to honor the spirit of an important deceased individual such as a former leader, general, or the King. The flag has a triangular "head," the corners of which represent the Buddha, the Sangha, and the Dhamma. The "ribs" of the body represent the Eightfold Path to Enlightenment: right view; right mindfulness; right concentration; right effort; right livelihood, right action; right speech; right intentions. The flags are often multicolored, but sometimes are white like this one. In Cambodian culture, white is the color of mourning.
